The incumbents will support a 10-week professional development program specifically designed for a group of in-service teachers of English who work in secondary public schools for the Tokyo Metropolitan Board of Education. The program is conducted in collaboration with [UBC English Language Institute](#). Applicants must have a minimum of a recognized master's degree with relevant teaching experience and academic expertise. They should be familiar with methods, assessment, and sociocultural issues of teaching English as a foreign language. Duties include teaching, provide academic support for individual participants after class, marking assignments as needed, reporting grades, and attending programmatic meetings.
