Duration: Full time, one year from the starting date, May 1, 2022.

Location: Department of Language and Literacy Education, University of British Columbia

Salary: \$50,000 per year plus benefits

Deadline to Apply: Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis, but no later than April 1, 2022

Responsibilities:

The main work duties of the postdoctoral fellow are in research. The post-doctoral fellow will be working under the supervision of Dr. Guofang Li and the research responsibilities will include assistance with:

- Systematic data analyses through both statistical and qualitative methods
- Reporting results in international and national scientific journals
- The identification of funding opportunities and writing of funding applications;
- Other research related activities.

Qualifications:

The successful candidate will, by the time of appointment, have a PhD in language education, applied linguistics, TESOL, or a related discipline. The candidate will demonstrate: evidence of strong research knowledge, skills and attitudes; an interest in early bilingual education and bilingualism; and a familiarity and success with scholarly publications. The ideal background includes mixed methods research, including HLM and qualitative techniques (such as qualitative interviewing and analysis). Proficiencies in Chinese are also a plus.

The position will remain open until filled.
