Duties

- Attends meetings with the Course Coordinator and the Instructors.
- Assists Instructors with various teaching responsibilities.
- Marks allocated student assignments and keeps appropriate records.
- Assists course instructors with assigned teaching responsibilities.
- Communicates with course instructors as needed.
- Performs other such associated duties, as may be assigned.

Qualifications

At minimum, candidates must have advanced training and/or be enrolled in a relevant master's degree (language education, applied linguistics, or a related field). Applicants who have completed their master's degree are preferred. Relevant teaching experience in a school setting, excellent communication skills and an ability to work collaboratively are also required. Applicants must demonstrate a thorough knowledge of and practice in teaching second language learners across the curriculum. An understanding of new curricular approaches to teaching and learning is preferred but not essential. Familiarity with multi-access technologies, including platforms like Canvas and Zoom, is also required.

Eligibility

To be eligible for a Teaching Assistant position, applicants must be registered as a student at UBC.
