The role of LLED Graduate Peer Focus Group Facilitator (henceforth, facilitator) is to work closely with the LLED self-study committee and assist in focus group data collection from current LLED PhD students with a focus on eliciting their experiences and perspectives relating to their registered programs. The facilitator will consult with LLED faculty members about the aims of the focus group interviews as well as the interview schedule and procedures. The facilitator will be responsible for recruiting possible participants, organizing and scheduling interview times with focus group participants, conducting focus group interviews, transcribing the interviews, analyzing the data, and creating a final written report of the focus group inquiry in line with the LLED self-study committee's guidelines.
